# **DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**

In order to graduate from the Master in Management, students need to complete:

Master 1 year (at their home university)

Master 2 year (2 semesters at ESCP Business School)

## Students must validate:



43 ECTS of management courses:

- Core courses, if needed, out of 9 MIM management compulsory courses (1 core course = 3 or 5 ECTS)
- Electives courses (15-hour course = 2,5 ECTS, 30-hour course = 5 ECTS)
- 2 seminars = 2 ECTS
- 2 French language courses = 1,50 ECTS (0,75 ECTS per semester)
- 1 Master's thesis (15 ECTS) at ESCP or at their home university
- 1 Research methods seminar (1 ECTS) at ESCP or at their home university
- Professional experience (3 ECTS): 36 weeks minimum.

## **ACADEMIC INFORMATION**

#### **Attendance**

Class attendance is strictly mandatory. Students will be expelled from a class:

- From the 3<sup>rd</sup> missed lecture of a 30h-course
- From the 2<sup>nd</sup> missed lecture of a 15h-course

No course can be dropped after it has already started.

#### **Exams**

Students are evaluated at the end of the semester. For electives, final exams are held during the last session. The final assessment might include: essays, in-class presentations, written quizzes and examinations and group projects.

Core course assessment is a written exam administered during the last week of the semester (see Academic calendar).

#### **Results**

Students can see their results online (after completing a short evaluation survey for each course), usually in February (S1) and June (S2).

Official transcripts will be sent directly to the home institutions.

## Working in other EU countries


Each EU country has its own job market with its unique do's and don'ts.

If you are interested in working in a country other than France, please check country specific advice on JobTeaser; each ESCP campus has its own careers advisors.

Please note that the VLS-TS you obtain in France will allow you to enter other EU countries, however it is mandatory to apply for a local resident permit within 90 days after your arrival. This local resident permit is also required to intern or work.

#### PRACTICAL INFORMATION

#### **Visa & Residence Permit**

If you are a citizen from the EU you do not need a visa. For non-EU citizens:

You need a "VISA VLS-TS" long séjour pour études (extended stay study visa with residence permit). Valid for more than 90 days to 1 year.

It is your responsibility to check with the nearest French Embassy/Consulate for the latest visa information. Dual Degree students should not enter France with a tourist visa.

Once you have obtained your relevant visa, you must apply for your French Residence Permit (Carte de Séjour), within 2 months following your arrival in Paris.

#### Insurance

Students will be asked to show proof of personal insurance, covering them for civil liability risks, repatriation/assistance, and individual accidents. Registration with the French health insurance provider is **mandatory** (and free) for all students whose stay exceeds 90 days. This last requirement does not apply to holders of an European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Check health insurance and personal insurance requirements.

## FINANCING YOUR STUDIES AT ESCP

## **Registration fees**

Dual Degree students pay registration upon admission to the programme before completing their registration as an M1 student at ESCP and a second instalment on the year they attend courses at ESCP as an M2 student.

Registration fees are due each academic year from registration until completion of the programme. If you do not complete all the requirements to graduate during your M2, you will have to register for the next academic year and pay the registration fee.

#### **Tuition fees**

Depending on the agreement signed with your Home Institution, ESCP may waive tuition fees entirely, please check with your Home Institution.

Dual Degree students pay tuition fees only once, in the year they attend courses as M2 students at ESCP.

As a reference, please find below the tuition fee for the 2021 intake:

EU citizens €18,250 per year. Non-EU citizens €21,850 per year.

A supplement of €1,100 to €2,050 will be due for those students required to take the catch-up semester of prerequisite courses (students without the required previous management studies). Fees are subject to modification without notice.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the exact date of the start of courses? The exact dates will be communicated to each student by our Programme Office; dates vary depending on the individual study plan and the requirement/exemption for pre-requisite courses.

Where can I find further information regarding the housing options? Your primary point of contact for any questions on housing is our Student Services office.

**Is there a mandatory or optional French course available before the beginning of the programme?** There is an introductory French seminar at the beginning of the programme and mandatory French courses throughout the academic year.

**Do you know the dates for course registration?** In May, you will receive a notification and instructions for course registration. Please check your ESCP Business School email.

Who should students contact to confirm the courses they have to take? Our Programme Office will contact you to discuss the study plan and clarify which courses you need to take.
